Notes (high-level summary):

- Introduce Rede Group Team (Jill, Kara, Beck, Alex, Erin and Alana) and OHA Team (Kaitlyn, Sarah “Sari” and Luci)
- Project Timeline (until Winter 2023)
 - SUD and CMHP involvement
 - Rede is currently conducting policy research/literature review (ongoing)
 - Generational differences included
- Expert Panel
 - 13 members currently on workgroup
 - Opinions from group: Above 15 may be too many people, Need all represented stakeholders; specifically BIPOC and underrepresented populations.
 - Suggestions from group: Reach out to potential stakeholders at Project Network, Miracles Group, Northwest Latino Institute, CSAP (Clackamas Substance Abuse Program for male offenders supervised by Community Corrections), and Measure 108 workgroup organizations.

- SUD Survey Purposes
 - Assess policies and recovery practices. Also, identify resources to support improved nicotine treatment and recovery practices.
 - SAMHSA Facility Locator- Accuracy is uncertain. If definitions vary it may impact the reliability. OHA does not have a clear list of facilities, either.
- 2020/2021 BH Provider Survey
 - Helpful tools and resources for treatment nicotine dependence
 - Top two results: Improvements in coding, billing, and payment systems and Training or technical assistance for staff to increase their capacity to treat tobacco addiction.
 - Opinions from group: Alternative methods to engage with people outside of smoke breaks, find out why people start smoking, etc.
- Topics of Interest
 - Info about facility, tobacco and vape use policies, treatment practices, barriers and resource needs
 - How many people actually use the treatment practices, what are the success rates (short term and long term)?
- Jamboard Activity
 - What do we want to know through a survey?
 - How do we get the survey out?
 - How do we get people to take the survey?
- Outcome of Jamboard
 - A possible partnership with the Community Partner Program of OHA or Application Assistors.
 - Cash incentives- Some organizations can and some cannot accept this form of incentive. This is an issue.
 - A followup to the survey is important. Email or phone call in addition to gentle reminders ahead of time. An expected amount of time for the survey included in the email, to give participants enough time to complete.
 - Include a recognizable name in the survey. A request from someone notable and respected. OHA and community mental health organizations.
- Next Steps
 - Small group to work on survey tool in Dec/Jan (David, Reina, Jim, Thais)
 - Develop framework for CMHP/CCBHC case study (Nirmala)
 - Set January expert panel meeting
