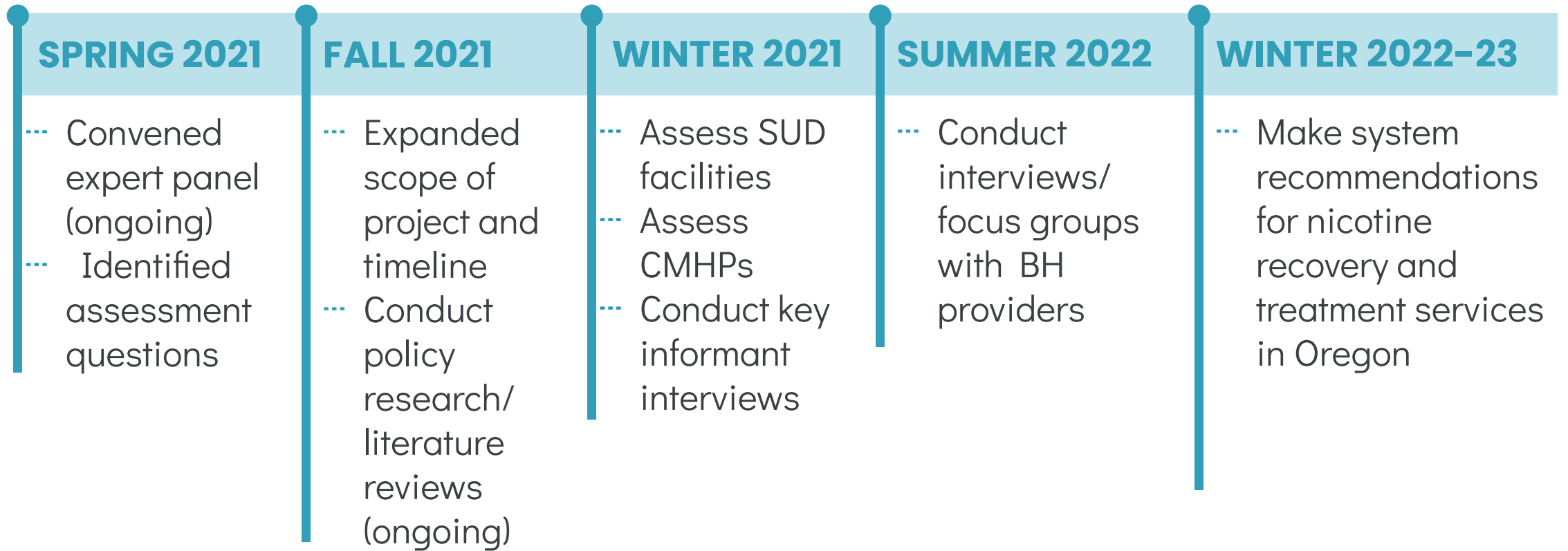

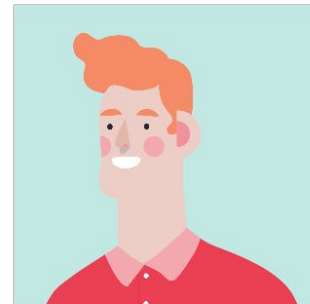
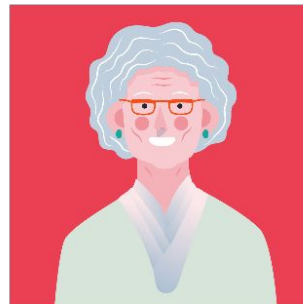


» Updates to assessment matrix

» **SUD survey purpose**

- Assess tobacco use policies and nicotine treatment and recovery practices at outpatient substance use facilities
- Identify resources to support improved nicotine treatment and recovery practices



» SAMHSA Facility Locator

Includes policy and practice data for Oregon facilities

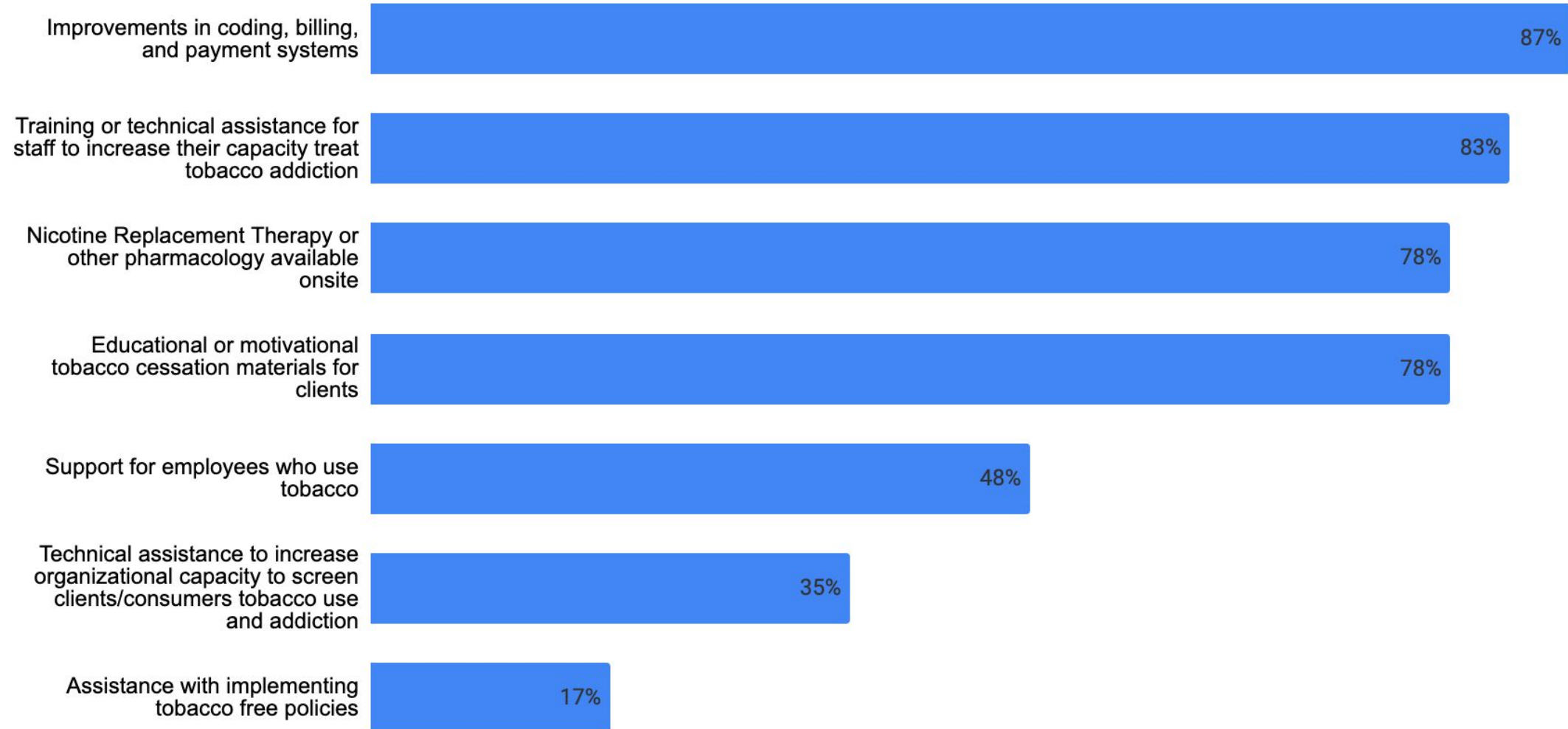
But.....how reliable?

- 182 outpatient SUD facilities
- 105 facilities prohibit smoking
- 55 facilities prohibit vaping
- 173 screen for tobacco use
- 146 provide cessation counseling
- 50 provide nicotine replacement therapy
- 53 provide non-nicotine cessation pharmacotherapy

» 2020/21 BH provider survey

- In collaboration with the Oregon Council for Behavioral Health and the Association of Oregon Community Mental Health Programs
- Electronic survey administered to behavioral health providers who are members of either organization
- Questions were designed to identify tools and resources that would help providers better provide cessation treatment services and find workgroup members

Helpful Tools and Resources for Treating Nicotine Dependence



» **Topics of interest**

- info about facility (services provided, estimated # staff/clients served, estimates of tobacco/vape use)
- tobacco and vape use policies
- treatment practices (ask, advise, assess, assist, referral, follow up)
- barriers
- resources needed
